

Madrid



Madrid blends it's cultural and artistic heritage with its cosmopolitan modernism.

The city's historical legacy is apparent in its medieval center dating back to the Hapsburg Empire and houses famous landmarks, such as the Plaza Mayor and the Royal Palace.

El Prado Museum has an impressive collection of artwork from many artists, including El Greco, Velázquez, and Goya. The Reina Sofia Museum includes artwork from Picasso, Dalí, and Miró, to name a few.

Walking tour of Segovia

Designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Segovia's rich history and dramatic architecture make it an ideal place to study.

Once ruled by Romans, Moors, and Christians, Segovia's architecture and urban layout illustrates the coexistence of different cultural communities throughout history.

Segovia boasts a well-preserved Roman Aqueduct (circa 1st-2nd century AD) in the city center, an 11th century castle (el Alcázar), and a 16th century Gothic cathedral.

GUIDED VISIT TO THE

Royal Site of San Lorenzo de El Escorial: World Heritage Site

Originally built to commemorate the victory of Spain over France in the Battle of San Quentin, El Escorial's royal palace and monastery united the royal and religious powers of Spain in the 16th century. The sprawling complex is an imposing example of Spanish Renaissance style and houses an extensive art collection, including many masterpieces by Bosch, El Greco, Rubens, Titian, and Bernini.
